Ride on the highest, steepest, water-powered funicular railway in the world!

Lynton & Lynmouth Cliff Railway

This incredible Victorian invention opened in 1890, joining the two villages of Lynton & Lynmouth, some 500ft (150m) apart. Two cars are joined by a continuous steel cable and ascend and descend on the principle of balance.

At the top, each car is filled with 700 gallons of water which then provides the weight to pull the other car up as it descends. It's as simple as that, and the views are simply breathtaking.

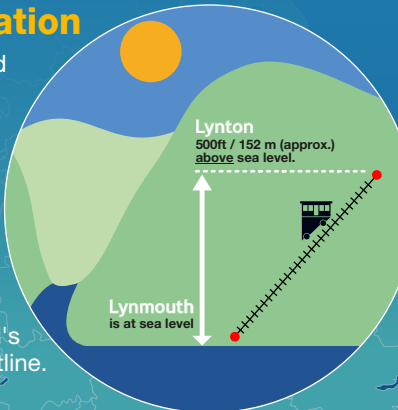

Exmoor is home to a variety of wildlife both great and small. The unique landscape of Exmoor provides a truly special habitat for the rarest of flora and fauna.

Extraordinary Location

The town of **Lynton** is perched on a cliff some 500ft/152m above the pretty harbour town of **Lynmouth**.

These two beautiful towns are joined by **Road**, **Path** or the incredible **Cliff Railway**.

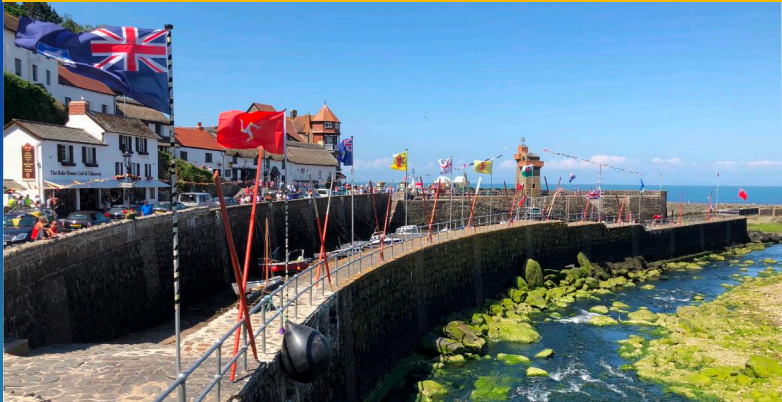

Watersmeet House is a 19th Century fishing lodge and England's oldest Edwardian tea room.

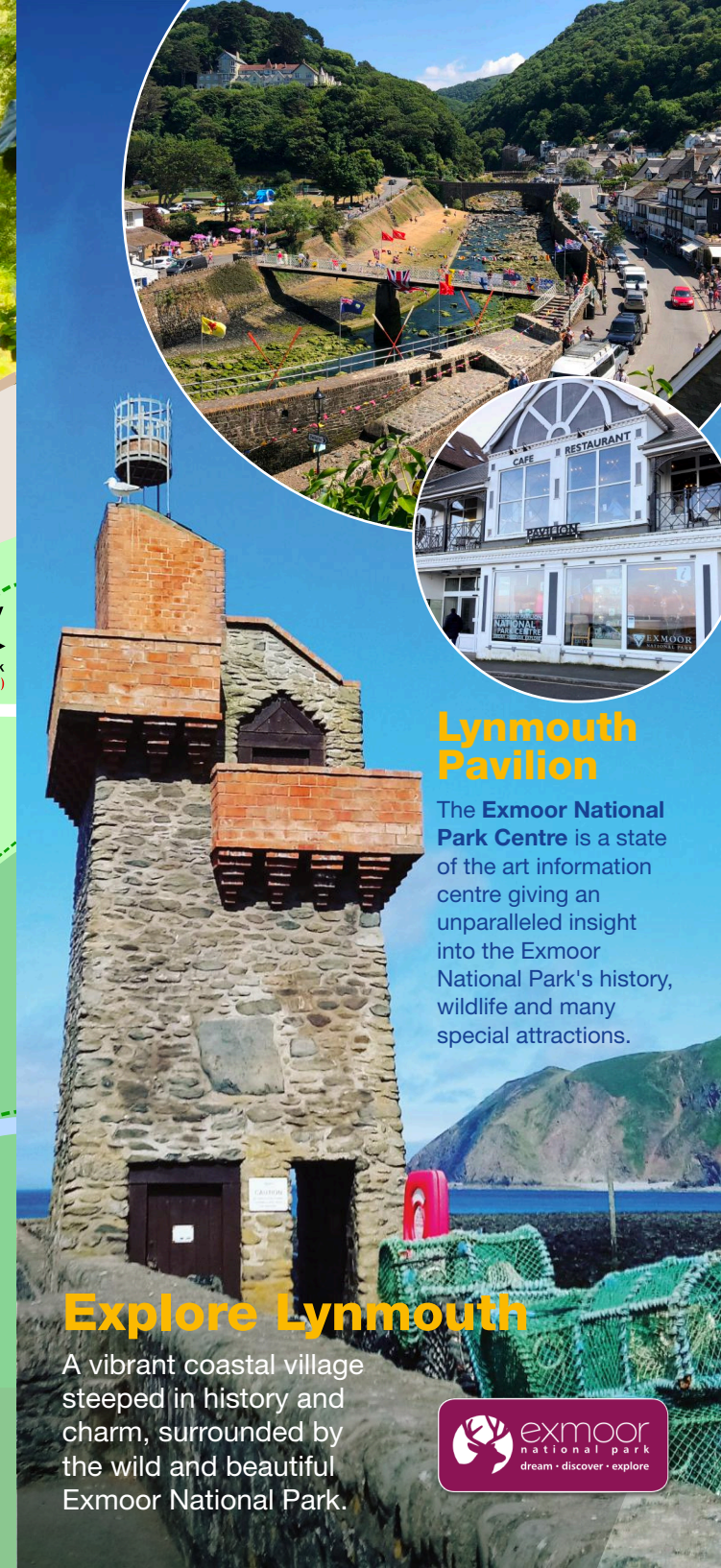
Set in one of England's deepest river gorges, surrounded by ancient woodland and beautiful waterfalls.
